Overview

The APM Practitioner Qualification is for project managers, project coordinators and team leaders who have three to five years' experience in managing noncomplex projects. This is an intermediate qualification for project management practitioners who can demonstrate an ability to manage non-complex projects or run a key control function of a large-scale project. This qualification (IPMA Level C) is for any relatively experienced professional who is looking to demonstrate their ability.

Pre-Requisites

- ✓ Passed the APMP qualification or
- ✓ Can demonstrate good familiarity with the APM Body of Knowledge (BoK) and have passed an equivalent qualification such as PMP®, ISEB Certificate in Project Management, Open University Project Management Module M865.
- ✓ Alternatively, delegates should have good foundation knowledge of project management,

- supported by evidence of relevant Continuing Professional Development (CPD).
- √ It is recommended to refresh your knowledge of project management best-practice for example through review of materials from previous training courses attended or APM's Body of Knowledge book.

Objectives

- ✓ The APM Practitioner Qualification is not a course; therefore no formal input of theory is included in this assessment process.
- ✓ By the end of the assessment centre, delegates will have been assessed against 30 criteria and demonstrated their ability to manage noncomplex projects from start to finish in a structured way.

Target Audience

Project managers, with a minimum of 3-5 years' experience in responsible leadership functions of non-complex projects, wishing to have their capability as a project manager recognised by a formal qualification.
