

# APM Practitioner Qualification (APMPQ) - Assessment Centre

## Overview

The APM Practitioner Qualification is for project managers, project coordinators and team leaders who have three to five years' experience in managing non-complex projects. This is an intermediate qualification for project management practitioners who can demonstrate an ability to manage non-complex projects or run a key control function of a large-scale project. This qualification (IPMA Level C) is for any relatively experienced professional who is looking to demonstrate their ability.

## Pre-Requisites

- ✓ Passed the APMP qualification or
- ✓ Can demonstrate good familiarity with the APM Body of Knowledge (BoK) and have passed an equivalent qualification such as PMP®, ISEB Certificate in Project Management, Open University Project Management Module M865.
- ✓ Alternatively, delegates should have good foundation knowledge of project management,

supported by evidence of relevant Continuing Professional Development (CPD).

- ✓ It is recommended to refresh your knowledge of project management best-practice for example through review of materials from previous training courses attended or APM's Body of Knowledge book.

## Objectives

- ✓ The APM Practitioner Qualification is not a course; therefore no formal input of theory is included in this assessment process.
- ✓ By the end of the assessment centre, delegates will have been assessed against 30 criteria and demonstrated their ability to manage non-complex projects from start to finish in a structured way.

## Target Audience

Project managers, with a minimum of 3-5 years' experience in responsible leadership functions of non-complex projects, wishing to have their capability as a project manager recognised by a formal qualification.
